- Specific: During the school year, St. Mary's will implement the 6+1 Writing Traits/Writer's Workshop in grades K-6. Third grade will pilot Simple Solutions Reading strategies throughout the 2023-24 school year to help our students increase their proficiency in writing.
- Measurable: The 6+1 Writing Traits will be implemented daily in all K-6 classrooms.
 Teachers will evaluate and assess writing samples horizontally and vertically each month to monitor and evaluate the curriculum. Our goal is for 60% of our 3-6 grade students to be proficient in writing on the ILearn in 2024.
- Achievable: Resources will be provided by our Tools for Success Coach, mentoring and coaching by colleagues, and the digital resources from 6 Traits.
- Relevant: The ILearn results from 2023 showed a deficit in writing across all grade levels. This focus on writing will address this issue.
- Timely: This will be implemented during the course of the 2023-2024 school year, and will be analyzed after the 2024 ILearn results are available.
